

Overseas Students Eligibility Criteria

Students must be eligible to study in the UK with one of the following criteria:

- ◇ UK Citizenship
- ◇ BNO Visa
- ◇ Leave to Remain/Enter
- ◇ Dependent Visa
- ◇ Pre-Settled Status
- ◇ Sponsored Ukrainian Families

British Overseas Territories Citizenship (BOTC)

In most cases, if you have satisfied the relevant requirements to become a BOTC, you can also become a British citizen.

Students intending to study in the UK on a BOTC Passport can stay in the UK no more than 6 months. If they wish to remain in the UK for a longer period, they must apply for a UK Passport or a Visa.

Please Note: Students intending to study in the UK for more than six months on a BOTC passport with the hope of applying for a UK passport when they arrive could face unnecessary delays upon arrival in the UK such as difficulties with enrolment. It is recommended that visitors to the UK, including students, ensure they travel with the correct passport for the duration of their travel before they enter the UK.

General Information About Joining us at Wymondham College

◆ International students MUST have a UK Guardian. The College is not able to recommend Guardians, however, we suggest contacting the Association for the Education and Guardianship of International Students (AEGIS) for a registered guardian.



AEGIS

- ◆ International students are able to study out of chronological year group by one year, up or down.
- ◆ We can offer assistance in arranging airport transfers.
- ◆ International families can be put in touch with other local families in the area who attend Wymondham College.

◆ Students applying for Year 12 to study A-Levels or BTEC Sport must achieve MQS, Minimum Qualification Score (or equivalency – we can help you work this out). Please scan the QR code for more information on entry requirements.



Sixth Form Requirements

- ◆ Boarding fees for Prep and Senior School students from £5000 per term. One term fee deposit is required on application.
- ◆ Boarding fees for Sixth Form students from £5500 per term. One term fee deposit is required on application.
- ◆ Suitability to board interview and reference from current school required on application.



Extracurricular Activities

◆ We measure progress not only by academic attainment but also by the journey of boarders into confident, happy, resilient, curious and caring young people. Wymondham Life is the name for our extensive range of extra-curricular activities and opportunities. The programme is rich and diverse with over 70 clubs and societies running each week from our outstanding Combined Cadets Force to our Concert Band and Jazz Orchestra. Staff provide opportunities linked to curriculum subjects such as 'Young Engineers', those that support well-being such as 'Cuddly Critters' and 'Mindfulness', and alternative off-site sports such as scuba diving, horse riding and skiing. Sporting clubs, both competitive and recreational are extensive, as are opportunities to participate in drama, music and debating.

What's included in the boarding fee?

◆ Education at the College is free as we are a state school. Included in the termly boarding fees are: boarding in one of our six houses; support from House staff; pastoral care; medical centre care; full meals everyday (breakfast, lunch and dinner); Wymondham Life activities (some activities require an additional fees such as horseriding); supervision and assistance with prep; Big Weekenders.

Boarding Houses

◆ We have six boarding houses at Wymondham College, all with their own house teams to provide support and guidance to our students.



Head of House Profile - Mr and Mrs Padreddii

◆ Fry Hall has been home for Heads of House Mr and Mrs Padreddii for the past six years. Fry boarders talk about 'coming home' after their lessons each day and both students and staff take pride in making Fry welcoming and homely.

Although Fry Hall is one of the smaller boarding houses, good use is made of the space and students can often be found at the pool table or air hockey table, watching Sky TV, playing on the Xbox, playing chess in the Prep room, lounging on the comfy sofas or deep in concentration in the Year 11 study room. There are extensive kitchen facilities available for use in the evenings and double ovens ready for baking goodies at the weekends. For Mr and Mrs Padreddii, a passion for boarding stems from their desire to support young people to become rounded individuals; they encourage students to succeed in their studies but also ensure they look after their own wellbeing and develop skills they will need later in life.
