WCPS' Enrichment Curriculum Activities
Programme (ECAs) - Part of 'Prep Life'

It gives me great pleasure to introduce you to our school's ECA Enriched Curriculum Activities Programme for the Autumn Term 2026. We will be working hard this year to continue the evolution of our Personal Development offer to everyone in our community. Our ECA programme is a central piece of our 'Prep Life' provision, similar to the College's 'Wymondham Life' offer. As our school grows, we will strive to continue offering a wide range of opportunities and experiences for our pupils to explore and enjoy. **Our Autumn Term's ECAs will run from Monday 14th September to Friday 4th December.**

Please note, there will be no ECAs on the Fridays of EXEAT weekends to support the overwhelming traffic and congestion on campus when all boarders at both WCPS and Wymondham College are leaving the site for the weekend: **Friday 25th September and Friday 20th November.** Please note, there will be no ECAs or WAC on the last day of each half term: **Friday 16th October.** There are also no ECAs on **Thursday 5th November and Tuesday 10th November** due to PPTC's running.

The purpose of our ECA programme is to provide your child with the opportunity to try new things they are curious about or for them to follow their current passions and interests. It is an opportunity for children to further enrich the curriculum they experience in school. It should be a time that they look forward to and can't wait to tell you about on the way home.

It is vital that your child has ownership of which ECAs they would like to do. Our ECA programme is not for the purpose of providing after school childcare. When selecting ECAs with your child, please ensure they are genuinely interested in attending and avoid selecting any ECAs out of convenience. We are trying to make a clear distinction between our After School Wraparound Care and our ECA 'Prep Life' offering.

For parents with children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2, it is important to remember that school days are long – learning is hard work. An ECA at the end of the day for some children might be a stretch too far and a 3:15pm finish may well be in their best interests.

ECAs will be provided by a mixture of internal staff members and external providers. You will be required to pay for the ECA in advance of the term starting. Details of how to pay will be emailed to you via SchoolCloud when your child's place is confirmed. This will be either a bank transfer, booking link or via the MCAS app. Please do not book any ECA's with external providers until your child's allocated ECA's have been confirmed by the school.

You will notice that Tuesdays will continue to be a day when only a very small number of paid ECAs are offered as this is the evening when staff engage with Professional Learning.

To sign up for your child's ECA, we will use SchoolCloud [SchoolCloud - Wymondham College Prep School](#). We will continue with the same sign-up process where ECA places will be allocated on a preference basis with a maximum selection of x2 ECAs per pupil.

Please note: All Boarding pupils will attend an ECA daily before Prep. Boarder allocations will be made by the school. If your child is boarding with us, please do not allocate any preferences for them via SchoolCloud.

As part of the preference-based sign up, you will be able to select 3 ECA choices for any given day, of which you will be allocated 3 ECAs over the course of the week. We encourage you to sign up for all the ECAs your child is interested in to ensure they get allocated 3 ECAs at this initial stage. Please see p.14 for further details on how SchoolCloud manages preferences.

If there are sufficient unfilled places in ECAs after the closing date then we will increase the booking capacity to x5 ECAs per pupil, re-open SchoolCloud and inform you so that you can book additional ECAs. Additional ECAs will be booked on a first come first served basis. If there are less than 5 children in an ECA we will have to make the decision to close the ECA in order to redistribute staff to take more popular ECAs that have extensive waiting lists. The waiting list link will be shared with you after the initial round of ECAs have been allocated and SchoolCloud has re-opened for any ECAs which may be already fully booked.

SchoolCloud sign up windows will go live on **Wednesday 1st July 6:00pm** and will close on **Wednesday 8th July 6:00pm**. As usual routine, there is no race to sign up first! When you log into SchoolCloud to choose your preferred ECA's you will at that time be shown how to navigate selecting your preferred ECA's. You will know your child's allocated ECAs for the Autumn Term by the end of day **Thursday 9th July**. ***Please remember to NOT book with any external ECA providers until you have received confirmation of your bookings from the school. Please take note of any dates where your child's allocated ECA may not be running and remember to collect them at 3:15pm or book them into wraparound care on these occasions.***

I hope your child feels inspired by our ECA programme and finds some new interests and passions.

How does the preference system work on SchoolCloud?

SchoolCloud ECAs are automatically allocated via the database based on the preferences entered into the system by families. The priority for automatic allocations is to offer the highest percentage of 1st place preferences over all other club preferences given - as an example, if 80% of students get a 1st place preference in the first step of allocations, the system will then prioritise the 20% of pupils that didn't, to get their 2nd preferences and so on.

We advise that families select up to 3 preferences where possible each day for the ECAs that their child is interested in to ensure they are allocated the 2x ECAs across the week in the first round. If you do not select enough preferences for your child, please be mindful that there are only limited spaces available on all ECAs and should your child not have enough preferences in place, there is no guarantee your child will receive 2 ECAs in the initial round.

We ask families to be mindful that there are more paid for ECAs available than internally run ECAs and therefore families are likely to receive at least one paid for club if these are selected as a preference. Please also be aware that due to the automatic allocation of ECAs, siblings may not receive ECAs on the same day.

The Autumn Term ECA waiting list will be published once all rounds of allocations have been made (i.e. if we open up to more than 2 spaces a week). We kindly ask that families do not email into the school asking for their children to be added to the waiting list in the meantime between ECAs being allocated and the waiting list being published.
