Our week






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Reception Rabbits & Robins

We have had a fantastic start to our new term. The children were excited to go on a 'plane journey' to Africa to start off our topic 'What is it like in Africa?'. We have been looking at world maps to learn where we live in relation to Africa and have also been locating countries that some of our children visited over Christmas eg New Zealand, India and France. We have learnt about the countries which make up the United Kingdom and their capital cities, as well as some of the countries in Africa. In Phonics we have started 'Phase 3' and this week we are learning the new digraphs ai, ee, igh, oa. In English we have started the book 'Handa's Surprise' which is set in Kenya. We have introduced writing frames for the children to write on during some of our English lessons and they have done so well with that.







Year 1 Otters & Seals

Year 1 pupils have made a brilliant start to 2025 and thrown themselves into all of our new learning topics. This week began thinking about 'Great Explorers' and brainstorming what might be packed in an explorer's bag. We did some dressing up and role play with real explorer clothing and objects! In English we have begun to write a travel journal entry about a safari adventure. It has been wonderful to see the children writing some amazing alliteration phrases this week as part of this. In PSHE we have talked about caring for others and considered how we know that someone cares for us. The children shared many personal examples of people in their lives who care for them at home and at school. In Maths we have looked at the teen numbers and explored how they are made with tens and ones. We have learned some new sounds and tricky words in phonics too - please see the sheet in your child's reading record.

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Year 2 Badgers & Foxes

This week in Year 2, we've had a wonderful mix of learning and creativity! In maths, we wrapped up our topic on shapes and began exploring money. The children have been identifying and counting pounds and pence, both coins and notes. Our nature walks have been a highlight, as we observed different habitats and discussed the wildlife that thrives in each. Back in the classroom, we created our own habitats in a box, bringing our observations to life. Inspired by artist Chris Kenny, we also made stunning artwork using thin twigs and sticks. It's been a busy and exciting week!





Year 3 Dragonflies & Bumblebees

We started the week with a PSHE lesson learning about 'The rule of law.' We had some fantastic discussions talking about the differences between laws and rules! It was wonderful to hear the views of the Dragonflies and Bumblebees! In Maths, we are starting our second unit of multiplication. To begin this learning we have been exploring related facts such as: $2 \times 4 = 8$ then $2 \times 40 = 80$. We realised that although the answer looks like it just has a 'O' on the end, we

multiplying the number by 10.
In English and History this week we have had a huge focus on the Romans! We learnt why the Romans invaded Britain, what gladiators were and we even made our own gladiator spears!!




