Back at school, we have written a recount of our day out to share our experiences and best bits. In Art we have designed the sculptures we will start to make next week and created a list of the things we will need. In Maths we are learning to count in 2s, 5s and 10s. Have a practise at home!

### Year 2 Badgers & Foxes

In English, we've started learning how to write non-chronological reports all about plants. We went on a plant hunt around school, using our senses to explore the sights, smells, and textures of nature. Everyone worked hard collecting exciting vocabulary and creating their own 'FANTASTICs' mind maps to describe what they saw and felt. In science, our tomato seeds arrived! The children came up with some brilliant wonder questions-especially about why scientists might want to send seeds into space, and how plants help by providing oxygen and healthy food for astronauts during long space missions. The children really enjoyed carefully planting the seeds and can't wait to spot the first tiny sprouts! And of course, the highlight of the week—our trip to Wroxham Barns! The children had a fantastic time meeting the animals and enjoying the great outdoors. It was such a fun and memorable day. 
### Year 3 Dragonflies & Bumblebees




