

Reception Rabbits & Robins

We have had a great first week back at school and enjoyed hearing all about your half-term adventures. This week we have been thinking about the question 'What do plants need to grow?'. The children have all enjoyed planting their own bean. They have been writing about what plants need and counting and sorting different beans. You may have noticed the beanstalks that we have made in our classrooms. In English we have finished off our unit 'All aboard the London Bus'. Hopefully the children will be able to tell you some of the places in London that we 'visited'. Although we haven't learnt any new sounds or tricky words in Phonics, you should still receive a guidance sheet on what you can support your child with at home. In Maths we have learnt about length and height.





Year 1 Otters & Seals

It has been lovely to welcome Year 1 back to school and hear all about their busy half term adventures. The children have been excited to get stuck into the new learning topics and to discover the plans for our upcoming KS1 Spring Production! In Maths, we have been working on place value to 50. This has included plenty of brilliant practical games such as 'quess my number' (with tens and ones clues) and 'race to 50'. In Geography we have looked at the continents of North and South America, learning about the differences between them and the countries within them. In English, we have started our new writing unit of 'The Storm Whale'. We have had lots of discussions about fruit and veg in D&T and have become experts in identifying which is which.

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Year 2 Badgers & Foxes

Welcome back to the second half of Spring Term. This week in English we have started writing a folk tale based on The Crow's Tale by Naomi Howarth. We have been focusing on repetition for effect and verbs. In Maths, we have been continuing with multiplication and division. Remember to keep practicing at home on TT Rockstars!

In Science we have started our new unit about life cycles. Firstly we recapped our learning from Year 1, recalling the 6 different animal groups and finding out

how they differ. We then spent time matching animals to their babies, finding out that some animal babies look the same as the adult and some completely different.

In History, we discovered who Charles was and how and why he was sent to prison for shooting a messenger pigeon during WW1.





Year 3 Dragonflies & Bumblebees

We've had a great week this week exploring light and shadows in science. We used torches to shine on various objects and ask questions about what happens to the shadows? How does a shadow form? What are sources of light? These are questions we will explore over this half

In Maths, we have been learning about ordering unit and non unit fractions and placing them on a number line. We will be starting to look at equivalent fractions next week. In English, we explored character description as we read 'George's Marvellous Medicine'. We compared the Grandma in this story, with other fictional Grandmas. We had great fun as we described Grandma's horrific features, her terrifying stare, her wickedly sharp nails and her mouth 'puckered up like a dog's bottom!'




Year 5 Emperors & Royals

In Art, we've begun looking at the work of different artists, who use more than one medium. Next week, we're excited about a visit to the college library and World Book Day!






Underwood Hall


