We've had another action-packed week of learning in Year 2! In maths we have been mastering the art of measurement, focusing on both centimeters and meters. In history, we have been exploring WW1 and the crucial role that codes and ciphers played during the war. We've been learning how messages were kept secret using clever writing codes and cryptography and had a go at creating secret messages! Our school play is fast approaching, and students are hard at work practicing their lines, choreography, and stage directions. 


Year 5 Emperors & Royals


