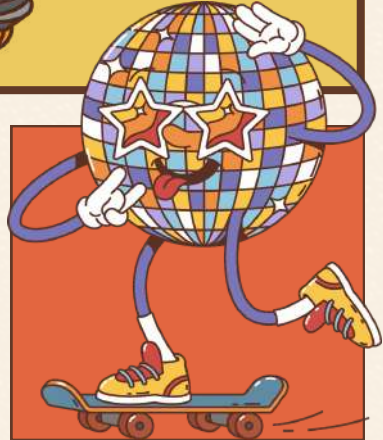
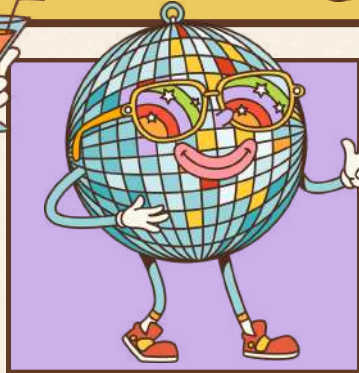
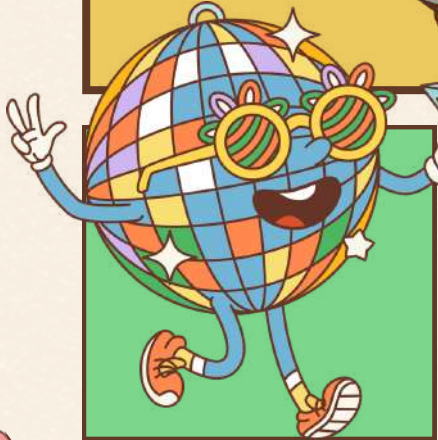

Reception Rabbits & Robins

Our focus this week has been 'The Three Little Pigs' and we have enjoyed so many activities linked to this, inside and outside. The children have enjoyed making dens for the pigs and we have heard lots of lovely vocabulary and phrases from the story. Our new English unit is an alternative version called 'Pigs Might Fly'. We were incredibly proud of our children (and Reception staff!) on Tuesday morning when we welcomed over 20 teachers and headteachers to spend the whole morning with us, as part of the DFE's RISE initiative. It was lovely to show off some of the things that we do. In Maths we have been making 9 and 10 in different ways. We continued the cross country theme in PE this week and did some laps around our field! One of the biggest highlights has been the frogspawn that we were very kindly given!



Year 1 Otters & Seals

This week has been busy with lots of practical learning opportunities. We have been thinking about measuring length and mass in maths, learning how to use a ruler to measure in centimeters and the balance scales to compare the mass of two objects. In DT we worked together in groups to create our fruit salads - a real highlight of the week! We have been thinking about food hygiene and how to chop foods safely and we applied this knowledge to the task. Best of all we taste tested the fruit salad and certainly enjoyed eating it! We are continuing to monitor our sunflower seedlings as part of our science learning and are really looking forward to bringing them home to care for next week. We also can't wait to see families at the KS1 show performances!

Dear Parents and Carers,

We're excited to let you know that as part of your family's eligibility to claim means-tested free school meals, your child can take part in the Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) programme – known locally as Big Norfolk Holiday Fun (BNHF) – completely free of charge.

Across Norfolk, we offer a wide variety of sessions, including:

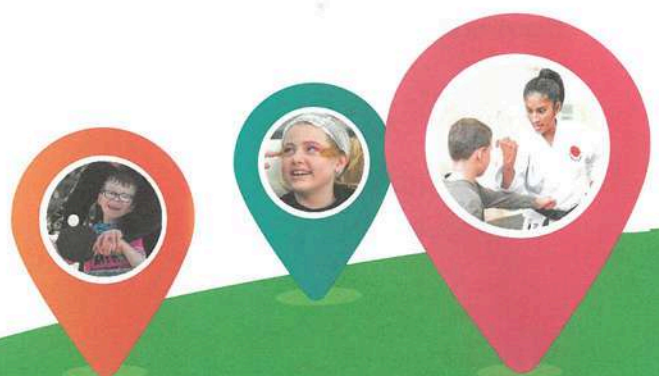
- Sports and outdoor adventures

The UK Government have announced upcoming changes to free school meal eligibility. All households receiving Universal Credit will be entitled to free school meals from September 2026. Please note that the current rules still apply for the next programme.
