It was wonderful to have a few parents

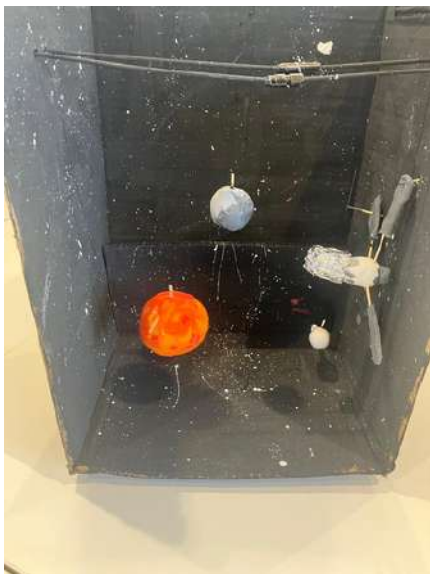

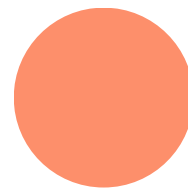

Reception Rabbits & Robins

We have had a fun week in Reception. Our focus has been all about snails. We have talked about how snails compare to other minibeasts and the children enjoyed making their own clay snails with Mrs Locksmith. In phonics we have looked at some more complex CCVCC words and learnt four new tricky words - do make sure you go through these with your child at home. In maths we have moved onto numbers 10-20, with a focus on 10-13. We have explored the composition of these numbers and looked at patterns as the numbers get bigger and smaller. On Wednesday and Friday lots of children had the sight and hearing check, they all did so well listening and following the nurses instructions. We have completed our Katie and the Sunflowers unit in English - the children have done brilliantly focusing at their tables when writing their sentences.



Year 1 Otters & Seals

As part of this term's PSHE unit, 'Healthy Me', we thought this week about road safety. We considered why it is important to stop, look, listen and think before deciding to cross (quickly and carefully!) and put our thoughts into action with some role play outside... complete with chalk drawn zebra crossings! In History we have learnt about toys and games that were played with in the 1960s. We had a go at playing with the Etch-A-Sketch, spinning tops and Spirograph set and really enjoyed exploring these. We've been thinking about materials in science and considered what some of the everyday classroom items are made from, noting that it may be more than one material. In Maths we've been thinking about sharing into equal groups (simple division).

Year 2 Badgers & Foxes

This week in Year 2, we had an exciting delivery from ! The children were thrilled to be challenged by astronauts to grow two bags of tomato seeds and investigate whether they will grow in the correct conditions. We have also started our own classroom experiment to germinate beans and are looking forward to observing the changes over time. In Maths, we enjoyed practical lessons exploring volume and the capacity of different containers using liquids. In English, we have continued developing our non-chronological reports by informing our readers all about plants and their leaves.



Year 3 Dragonflies & Bumblebees

Year 3 have had a busy and exciting week! We have been rehearsing like crazy for our upcoming performance, and it is all starting to come together beautifully. In English, we wrote independent fact files about our dragons, using models and pictures to bring them to life by creating diets, habitats and unique personas. In maths, we have been learning about money, including converting pounds to pence. In geography, we explored why New Zealand experiences so many earthquakes. We also enjoyed the sunshine with lots of fun outdoor activities between rehearsals. Well done, Year 3!

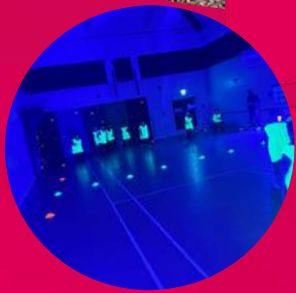

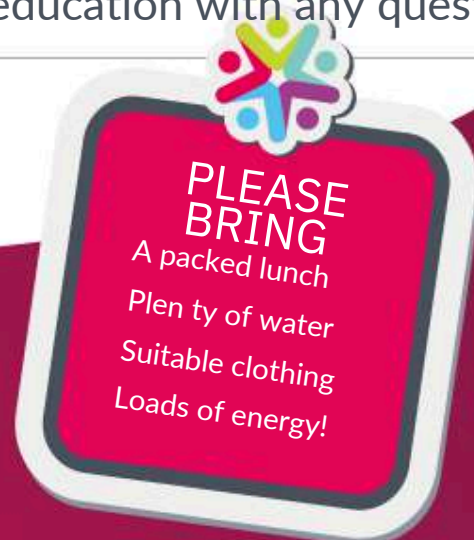
